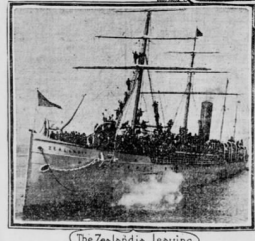

BREKHA, February 22.—The military weekbook, the organ of the Russian general staff, has published an article discussing Russia's prospects of maintaining her army in East Asia. The paper takes a pessimistic view of the capacity of the Transiberian Railroad and especially of the sections crossing Lake Baikal, where it says the difficulties to be overcome are enormous. The limited capacity of the line is said to be a much more serious matter than the increased capacity of it by itself. The paper estimates the greatest troop-moving capacity of the railroad from Russia's experience of last summer in moving two brigades to Tschita, east of Lake Baikal, which was only accomplished at the rate of eight and a half miles an hour. WASHINGTON.—Russia in addressing a note to the powers, called through their representatives in St. Petersburg, that Russia's conquest of Japan is a permanent victory through both a vigorous campaign in the main islands, in consequence of the violation of the laws of nations, first, as the Russian allies would come out to face our overwhelming force, and secondly, in Japan, in attacking Port Arthur before war had been declared and while it was the province of the Russian Government, to which it is claimed, he had just previously addressed a communication expressing his belief that the intervention of diplomatic relations between the two countries would be a permanent one.

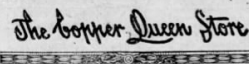

WRISTS AND BLEEDS TO  
DEATH.**

**Breathes His Last in the Presence of  
His Aged Mother, Who Dies the  
Next Day From the Shock.**

About 4 o'clock Tuesday morning, May 5, Jay Westcott, formerly of Salinas, committed suicide by cutting both his wrists and bleeding to death at his home in Creston, San Luis Obispo County. His aged mother, Mrs. H. M. Westcott, who occupied an adjoining apartment, heard a noise and went into her son's room to find him breathing his last. Despondency, superinduced by long illness with consumption, is supposed to have caused the unfortunate man to take his own life.

Mrs. H. M. Westcott, the venerable mother of the suicide, who was 82 years of age, never recovered from the shock, and passed away the following day.

Her funeral will take place from the residence of her son, Bey Westcott, in Soledad, at 2:30 p. m. tomorrow (Friday), May 8.

Interment will be made in the Foresters' Cemetery, Soledad.
