heaven

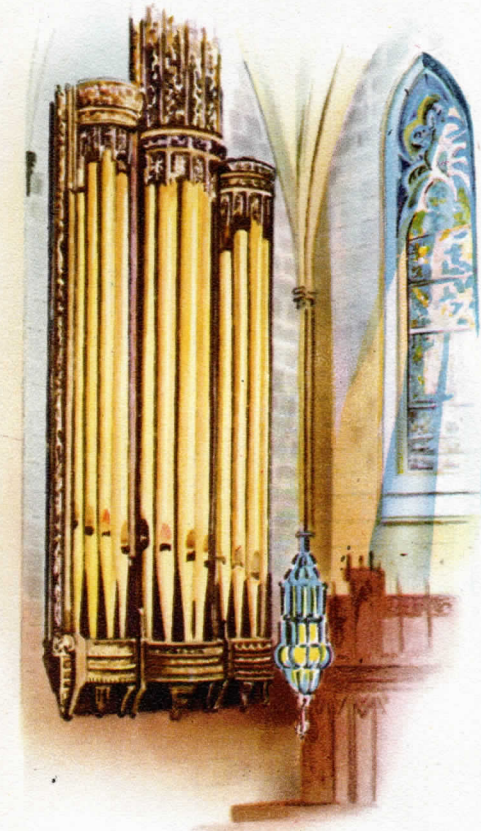
As the dawn comes through.
