## **STUKELY WESTCOTT, 1592 - 1677**

Planter and colonizer, one of the 13 original proprietors of Providence Plantations and Colony of Rhode Island; of Salem, Mass., 1635, Providence, R.I., 1638, and Warwick, R.I., 1647. His wife, Juliana Marchant. Their children: Damaris (Arnold), Samuel, Robert, Amos, Mercy (Stafford), Jeremiah. Spelling of the name has changed through the years even within the same family group. Spelling can read Westcott, Wescott, Westcot and other spelling variations.

## Meet the Spragues

William Srague IV (1830–1915) was (once and then again later) fabulously wealthy, heir to the A.& W. Sprague Manufacturing Company. He was the governor of Rhode Island at the start of the

Civil War, formed his own artillery company, marched to defend Washington, D.C., and then fought at Bull Run.

Sprague later served in the U.S. Senate and was the first Narragansett Town Council President (1900). But his greatest battles were with his first wife Kate Chase, daughter of Lincoln rival Salmon P. Chase and the *Belle of Washington*, and with her lover Senator Roscoe Conkling.



The Spragues built an

elegant mansion on Canonchet Farm (site of the South County Museum), the largest private residence in Rhode Island before the mansions of Newport were constructed. The building burned to



the ground in 1909. Sprague then moved to Paris with his second wife (and the source of his second fortune), Dora Inez Calvert. He died in Paris in 1915.





# Welcome to the South County Museun

Here Rhode Island's coastal legacy has been celebrated since 1933, where you can explore a rich heritage of the local rural and coastal life. The museum's beautiful eight-acre campus is located on a 174-acre town park that was once the 19th-century estate of Rhode Island's Civil War-era governor and postwar senator, William Sprague IV.

We gather in the Metz Exhibit Building where the featured display focuses on the Westcotts and other fishermen who made Galilee, R.I. the second busiest commercial fishing port in New England.

## Blacksmith Shop

and Some Descendants of Stukely Westcott including the museum's linotype machine and 28 original cut blocks used to illustrate the first volume.




# Our Path "The Grand Highway"

Before the arrival of the first Europeans, Wickford was a small island bounded on the north by what is now Mill Cove (North Cove), on the south by Academy Cove (South Cove), on the east by Wickford Harbor, and on the west by a narrow neck of water connecting Mill Cove and Academy Cove. It was populated by the Narragansett tribe who, around 1637, sold parcels of this land to both Roger Williams and Richard Smith. Following Smith's acquisition of Williams' property, the Cocumscussoc plantation or Smith's Castle, as it came to be known, became a center of social, political and religious life in the area.

Lodowicke Updike, the grandson of Richard Smith, developed Cocumscussoc into one of the great plantations of New England. Over time, it came to encompass more than 3000 acres. In 1709, he laid out a formal village with a wide street (The Grand Highway) leading to the harbor, which became Wickford's present Main Street. Additional streets were then laid out and lots were offered for sale, each "with three rods of frontage."

The protected harbor was key to the prosperity of the village. Over time, it evolved from a primary port supplying and transporting the produce of the "plantations" of the early 1700's to a booming facility for shipping and shipbuilding after the Revolutionary War. Unlike Newport on the other side of the bay, Wickford was left mostly "untouched" by the Revolutionary War, becoming a haven for wealthy Newport residents seeking to avoid the British occupation of their town. Many of Wickford's historic houses date from this post-war boom period (1780–1830) as it gained in prominence as an active shipbuilding and trading center.




